

## What is an adverb?

An adverb is a word that describes a verb. It tells you about an action, or the way something is done.





Many adverbs are made by adding -ly to adjectives.



## For example:






kind + ly= kindly
The boy kindly carried the old lady's bags.

fierce + ly= fiercely
The dog is barking *fiercely*.

bright + ly= brightly
The sun is shining *brightly*.







sadly loudly slowly happily quietly



Some adverbs describe the way something is done. They are called adverbs of manner.

#### For example:

- The driver braked suddenly.
- · She played skillfully.
- Look closely at these footprints.
- The twins liked to dress differently.
- Please speak clearly.

Some adverbs describe when something happens. They are called adverbs of time.

#### For example:

- John has just arrived.
- Can I do my work
   later? No, do it now.
- Everyone arrived early.
- It's snowing again.
- She will finish it tomorrow.

Some adverbs tell you where something happens. They are called adverbs of place.

#### For example:

- Mom and dad are watching TV upstairs.
- It's raining. Let's go inside.
- · Come here!
- There are trees everywhere.
- The miners are working underground.
