






Listening Test:

- Time: 30 min.
- Sections: 4
- Questions: 40
- Answers: 10 min. transfer
- Recording: Played once





Incorrectly spelt words are marked as incorrect.

Before you listen:

 Read the instructions, so you know the word limit or if they are looking for a number!

Read the questions to help predict the topic and order you will hear the information and answers in.

Think about synonyms and paraphrases you might hear in the recording.

While listening:

- Listen carefully to the introduction because it will give you information about the recordings.
- Note down your answers quickly do not worry about spelling at this stage.
- Do not panic if you miss an answer. Just move on to the next question.
- Use the time between the recordings to read ahead. Read the next set of questions and predict the content of the next recording.
- Remember that the answers must be the exact word forms from the recording!!!

After Listening:

• Make sure you transfer your answers to the answer sheet carefully and check that they match the question numbers!!!

 Check your spelling. You must spell answers correctly and use capital letters where necessary.

 If you have any gaps on your answer sheet, have a guess and write something.



Think of synonyms / paraphrasing:

- 1. Borrow books
- 2. Use private study areas
- 3. Print an essay
- 4. Access the journal archives
- 5. Pay fines

Synonyms / Paraphrasing

- 1. Borrow books: Take out / loan books
- 2. <u>Use private study</u>: Work in specific places for self-study
- 3. Print an essay: Produce a copy of your assignment
- 4. Access the journal archives: Take out journals from the archive section
- 5. Pay fines: Pay the money owed for overdue books
