


Question Mark



Lesson objectives:

- to understand how question marks are used in sentences
- to use question marks effectively in oral and written language





A question mark is always placed at the end of a question.

Example: What are you doing?

Questions mark?



Use a question mark when you are trying to get information. This type of sentence is called an *interrogative sentence*.


For example:



Who is your teacher?



Question mark?



Usually, the  signals the end of the sentence so a capital letter should begin the next sentence.



What was that in the darkness? He could not tell.



Question mark?





Many interrogative sentences start with question words such as who, what, when, where, why or how and end with a question mark.

Examples:

- Where is the gas station?
- Why did you stop here?
- How did you do that?
- What color is the shirt?
- When will you arrive?



Question mark?



Interrogative sentences can also start with forms of the words "do" and "be."

Examples:



- Did they go to the party?
- Does he like apples?
- Do you know her name?
- Are you there?
- Is she the teacher?
