

Ex:1 Complete the sentences. Use the correct form of the verbs in brackets.

If she **phones** (phone), I'll let you know.

1. If I **am not** (not be) busy, I'll come.
2. If he **was/were** (be) careful, he wouldn't break so many things!
3. If we didn't have to work late, we **would join** (join) you.
4. If she breaks that vase, Grandma **will be** (be) furious!
5. Unless you **stop** (stop) wasting time, I'm leaving right now!
6. I can't help you if you **don't give** (not give) me more information.
7. If a fire **starts**(start), the alarm goes off.
8. You **should make** (should/make) your own food if you don't like my cooking!
9. **Take** (take) more exercise and you'll feel much better soon.
10. If it wasn't raining, we **would go**(go)for a walk.

Ex: 2 Write two sentences for each item.

0. We/ leave at eight, we / arrive on time

Likely: If we **leave** at eight, we'll **arrive** on time.

Less unlikely: If we **left** at eight, we'd **arrive** on time.

1. I / not be busy, I / pick you up

likely: **If I'm not busy, I'll pick you up.**

less likely: **If I wasn't/weren't busy, I'd pick you up.**

2. you / fall, you / break your leg

likely: **If you fall, you'll break your leg.**

less likely: **If you fell, you'd break your leg.**

3. we / not leave now, we / be late

Likely: **If we don't leave now, we'll be late.**

less likely: **If we didn't leave now, we'd be late.**

4. you / get the job, we / have a party

likely: **If you get the job, we'll have a party.**

less likely: **If you got the job, we'd have a party.**

5. the questions I be easy, everyone / pass the test

likely: **If the questions are easy, everyone will pass the test.**

less likely: **If the questions were easy, everyone would pass the test.**

Ex:3 Complete the second sentence so that it has a similar meaning to the first sentence, using the word given the word given. Use between two and five words. Do not change the words given.

0. *She has to do this herself because she doesn't have a secretary.*

HAVE

*She **wouldn't have to do** this herself if she had a secretary.*

1. I'll let you borrow my laptop if you promise to be careful.

LONG

*You can borrow my laptop **as long as you promise to be careful.***

2. I can't help you **with your** homework because I'm not very good at math's.

COULD

*If I were better at math's **I could help** you with your homework.*

3. If we win the elections, we will build more schools.

PROVIDED

*We will build more schools **provided (that) we win the elections.***

4. They won't let you into the theatre without a ticket.

UNLESS

*They won't let you into the theatre **unless you have / you've got / you've bought a ticket.***

5. Bring your sun cream because we may decide to go for a swim.

CASE

*Bring your sun cream **in case we decide to go for a swim.***

Ex: 4 Complete the sentences. Use the correct form of the verbs in brackets.

0. If you **had come** (come) to the theatre yesterday, you **would have enjoyed** (enjoy) the play.
1. If I **had come** (come) to Athens last year, I had come, **would have visited** (visit) you.
2. If we **had known** (know) you already had tickets, we wouldn't have got (not get) any of you.
3. If you **hadn't destroyed** (not destroy) my computer, I **wouldn't need** (not need) a new one now!
4. If you **hadn't left** (not leave) the party so early on Saturday, **you might have met** (might/meet) Joe.
5. If you **hadn't spent** (not spent) all your money, your father **wouldn't be** (not be) angry now.
6. I **could have become**, (could / become) an accountant if I **was/ were/ had been** (be) good at math's.
7. If she **had tried** (try) harder, she **would have got** (get) that promotion last year.
8. He **wouldn't have got** (not get) the job of he **had missed** (miss) his interview.
9. If I **had met** (meet) you before, my life **would be** (be) different now
10. If he **hadn't seen** (not see) that car, there **would have been** (be) an accident.

Ex: 5 Write 3rd conditional sentences.

0. I felt tired. I went to bed early.
If I hadn't felt tired, I wouldn't have gone to bed early.
1. I didn't have enough money. I didn't take a taxi.
If I had had enough money, I would have taken a taxi.
2. I wasn't interested in the film. I didn't go to the cinema.
If I had been interested in the film, I would have gone to the cinema.
3. We took the wrong turning. We arrived late.
If we had taken the wrong turning, we wouldn't have arrived late.
4. Romeo thought Juliet was dead. He committed suicide.
Rome wouldn't have committed suicide if he hadn't thought Juliet was dead.
5. Oliver lied. He was punished.
Oliver wouldn't have been punished if he hadn't lied.
6. I didn't go to the wedding. I wasn't invited.
I would have gone to the wedding if I had been invited.
7. I was afraid of the dark. I didn't go downstairs.
If I hadn't been afraid of the dark, I would have gone downstairs.
8. You didn't train hard enough. You didn't win.
If you had trained hard enough, you would have won.
9. He didn't apologize. She didn't forgive him.
If he had apologized, she would have forgiven him.
10. She didn't have a car. She had to take a taxi.
If she had had a car, she wouldn't have had to take a taxi.
