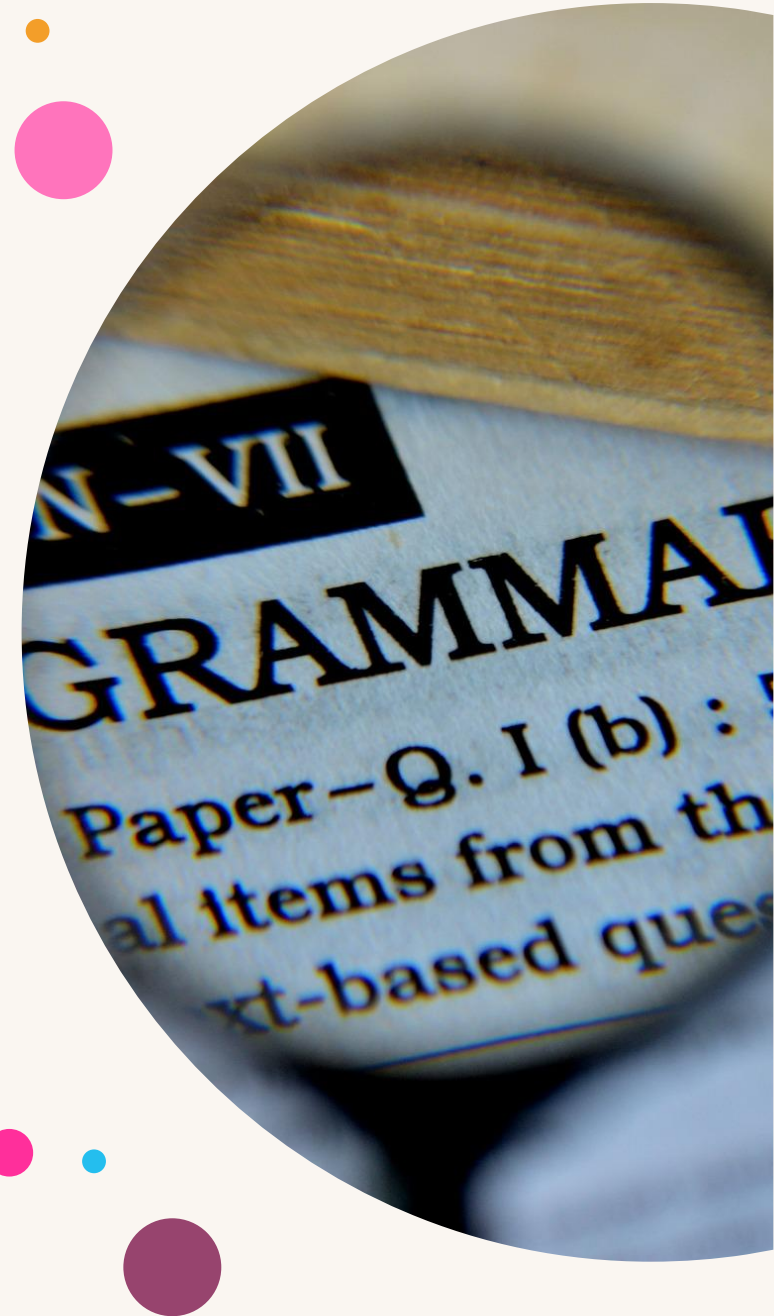

What is regret?

To feel sad, repentant, or disappointed over
(something that one has done or failed to do).

What grammar point did you discuss last week ?

CONDITIONALS

CONDITIONAL 0

Used to talk about facts or situations which are always true

When you heat water, eventually it boils.

Condition

Result

If people don't eat or drink, they die.

Condition

Result

CONDITIONAL 1

when we talk about future situations we believe are real or possible.

If I miss the train, I will catch the next one.

Condition

Result (50% chance it will happen.)

If it rains, I won't go to the park

Condition

Result (50% chance it will happen)

CONDITIONAL 2

to talk about improbable or impossible situations in the present or future

If I had more time, I would do my LMS.

Condition

Result (probably not true.)

If I had more time, I would exercise more.

Condition

Result (unlikely)

CONDITIONAL 3

- **To talk about impossible situations**
- We often use the third conditional to describe regrets.

If I would have left earlier, I would have made it on time.

Condition

Result (Regret)

Main Clause

Talk about the PAST

An unreal past

Imaginary situation / result
in the past

How many clauses do you think the 3rd conditional has?

2 Clauses

If Clause

Main Clause

Talk about the PAST

It's not real / true because we can't change the past.

Used to talk about regrets things we wish were different.

What is the feeling of the sentence?

If I had left earlier, I wouldn't have missed my flight.

I'm sad I missed my flight.

I regret that I missed my flight.

I wish I could go back and change it.....but I can't because my flight is gone.

What is the feeling of the sentence?

If you hadn't been so rude, they would have invited you back.

I'm feeling frustrated.
I'm telling you how you should have acted.

What 3 things are the 3rd conditional for?

1. Things we regret in the past.
2. Wish we could change something in the past.
3. Tell someone off about something they did in the past.

Forming the 3rd Conditional Sentence

If + past perfect , perfect conditional



Past Perfect: What is it?

Subject + had + past participle verb.

If I (subject) + had + left (past participle) earlier,

If you hadn't been so rude, they would want you
to come back.

Perfect Conditional: What is it?

Subject + would have + past participle verb.

...I (subject) + wouldn't have + missed(past participle)
my flight.

Perfect Conditional: What is it?

Subject + would have + past participle verb.

If you hadn't been so rude, they would have wanted you to come back.

What is the full 3rd conditional sentence order?

If + subject + had + past participle verb , sub + would + have
+ past participle

Which tone (kind) of 3rd conditional am I using?

1. If you **had called** me, I **would have** come.

I wish I could change this.

Past or present?

Did it actually happen?

2. If she **had replied** to my message, I **wouldn't have been** so worried.

I'm frustrated. I am telling someone off.

3. If I **had studied** for the exam, I **wouldn't have** gotten an F.

Expressing regret.

Modal Verbs:

Might have =

Probability / certain. 50% chance
I might do it
I might not

Would have =

More likely to do it. 60-80%

Could have =

Possibility / ability
Not saying I would....but I could.

Conditional 3:

If – clause (condition)

If + past perfect/perfect continuous
(had + past participle)

Main clause (result)


Would/could/might + have + past participle
(ex: would have done)

If they had invited us, we would have gone to the party.

If he had been listening, he might have heard what the teachers said.

If I had studied harder, I would have passed my exam.

If you had had some experience, they would have hired you.

If he knew he would get a ticket, he wouldn't have used his phone.
