



FUTURE PASSIVE

FUTURE SIMPLE PASSIVE

Future Simple Passive is used to talk about an action that is going to happen in the future. In the passive voice, emphasis is put on the effect of an action rather than on the doer.

POSITIVE FORM +

- subject+will be+past participle

STRUCTURES

NEGATIVE FORM -

- subject+will not be+past participle

QUESTION ?

- will+subject+ be+past participle

WHEN TO USE FUTURE SIMPLE PASSIVE

We use Future Simple Passive for actions or events that will happen in future (tomorrow, next week, in 2023). Unlike the Future Perfect Passive, there's no deadline here. In such statements we focus attention on the person or thing affected by the action, when the subject is unknown, unclear or irrelevant.

EXAMPLES

- **Active - The company will build the bridge next year.**

Passive - The bridge will be built next year.

- **Active - They will publish the book next year.**

Passive - The book will be published next year.

-In these examples, the focus is on the effect of the future action, it's not important who will perform the action.

EXAMPLES

- The football match won't be played because of bad weather.
 - We won't be sent to the conference.
-
- Will Jane be visited by her relatives from New York?
 - Will the room be cleaned tomorrow?
