<b>go in for:</b>	<i>enter; take part in (a competition)</i>
<b>go off:</b>	<i>1) (of a bomb, etc.) explode; 2) (of an alarm) ring, 3) (of food) go bad</i>
<b>go on:</b>	<i>1) continue, 2) happen</i>
<b>go out:</b>	<i>stop burning; be extinguished</i>
<b>go through:</b>	<i>1) examine, 2) experience</i>
<b>go up:</b>	<i>rise; increase (<b>opp:</b> go down)</i>
