The Capital Letter

The capital letter is also called a big letter or uppercase letter, or sometimes just a capital.

ABCDEFGHIJKLMN
HIJKLMN
OPQRST







Use a capital letter for the first letter in a sentence:





The dog is barking.
Come here!
My father is a doctor.











Always use a capital letter for the word I:





I am eight years old. Tom and I are good friends.











Use a capital letter for the names of people:





Alice, Tom, James, Kim, Snow White, Alimaa, Dorj, Harry Potter











Use a capital letter for the names of places:





National Museum, Bronx Zoo, London, Ulaanbaatar, Sukhbaatar Square











Use a capital letter for festivals, holidays, days of the week, months of the year:





New Year's Day, Christmas, Mother's Day, Sunday, Monday, Friday, January, May, July, October


